Climate Change/Care of the Earth

Income Inequality - the Increasing Gap between the Rich and the Poor (globally, nationally, locally)

Human Rights, especially empowering women and children, and ending human trafficking and slavery.

STRATEGIES/ACTIONS

We want to live as global citizens, working to create a global community of compassion and hope where:

women and children are respected;

income inequality is denounced and all persons have what they need;

refugees find a home;

families have access to food, sanitation, healthcare and education;

victims of violence and human trafficking find safety and protection;

all persons act responsibly in using the diminishing resources of our fragile earth community;

nations strive to live in peace, choose dialogue instead of conflict and transform their weapons into ploughshares;

the development of peoples, communities and the Earth is sustainable.

We ask that Areas of the Institute respond to these urgent issues of our times in prophetic hope and action and in accordance with their diverse realities and possibilities.

In a spirit of hope, we suggest these strategies as possible actions to move forward with this commitment:

Active involvement in the United Nations (NGO) with a focus on the Sustainable Development Goals and documenting how our ministerial work contributes to the implementation of the SDGs.

Studying Church documents on current issues: e.g., peace, systemic racism, Earth as our common home, human trafficking.

Sharing stories of our sisters and those with whom we collaborate that demonstrate actions furthering this vision.

More direct engagement with other Institute Teams/ Committees: Communications, Formation, Institute Stewardship.

Advocacy through letter writing, statements, newsletters, demonstrations that offer a public forum for JPIC action.

Use social media and networking forums to address issues of care for the Earth, wealth disparity, and human rights.

Collaborate with the Vatican's journey of sustainability, in the spirit of the Laudato Si' Action Platform, by promoting programs that ensure a future for coming generations.
